

# Don't flush foreign objects down the sewer! !

If foreign matter that cannot be processed is discharged into the sewage facility, the sewer pipes will become clogged or the sewage treatment plant machinery will malfunction, and the treatment function will cease. In the worst case scenario, the use of the water supply may have to be restricted along with the cessation of sewer service.

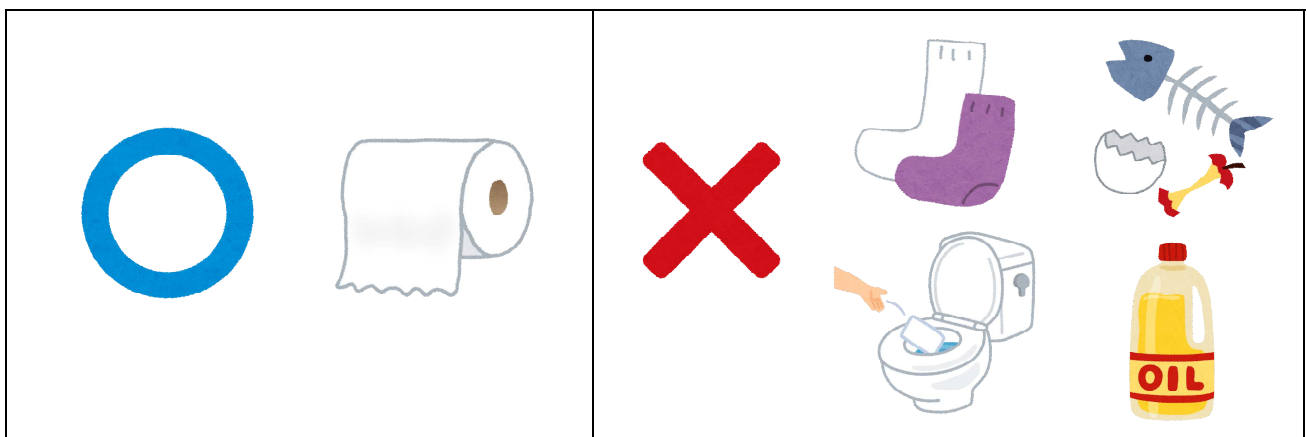
## ○When the sewers are clogged...

Sewage flushed from flush toilets, kitchens, etc. cannot flow to the sewage treatment facility and overflows from nearby manholes onto the street. In addition, it may also back up through drains such as toilets.

## ○We need everyone's cooperation not to flush anything that is not soluble in water!

Items that should not be flushed down the sewage system (toilets, kitchen and other drainage systems)

- Water-insoluble papers: tissue paper, paper towels, diapers, etc.
  - \*As a general rule, do not flush anything other than toilet paper.
- Cloths and clothing - underwear (shirts, pants, etc.), towels, handkerchiefs, kitchen cloths, etc.
  - \* Even if you drop it in the toilet, be sure to pick it up.
- Oils - Residual and waste oils such as tempura oil, engine oil, etc.
  - \* Oils can also solidify and clog sewer pipes and pumps. Volatile oils can also pose a risk of ignition or explosion if flammable gases are generated in sewer pipes.
- Other items such as food scraps from cooking, gum, cigarettes, plastic bags, etc., should never be flushed.
